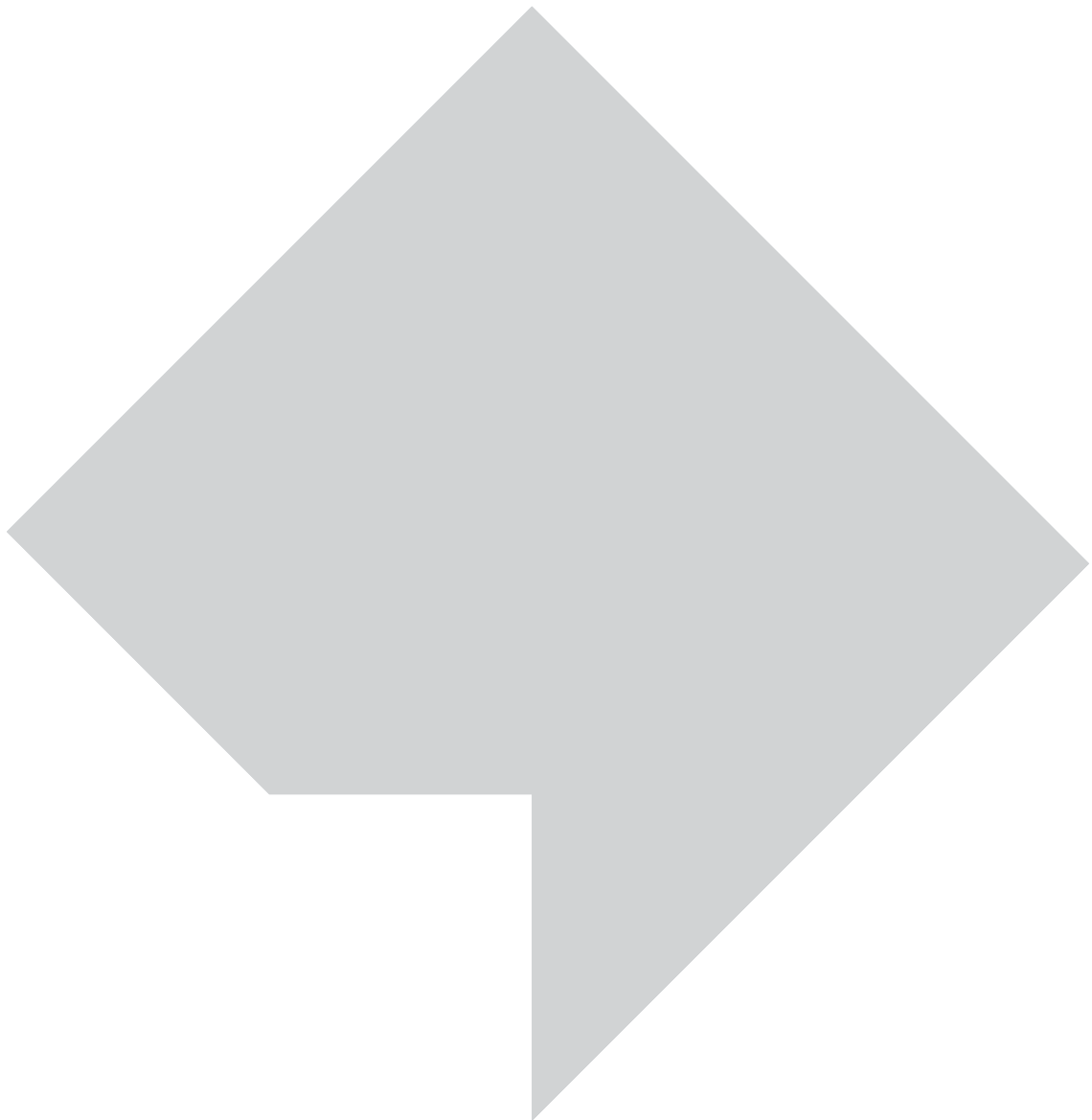
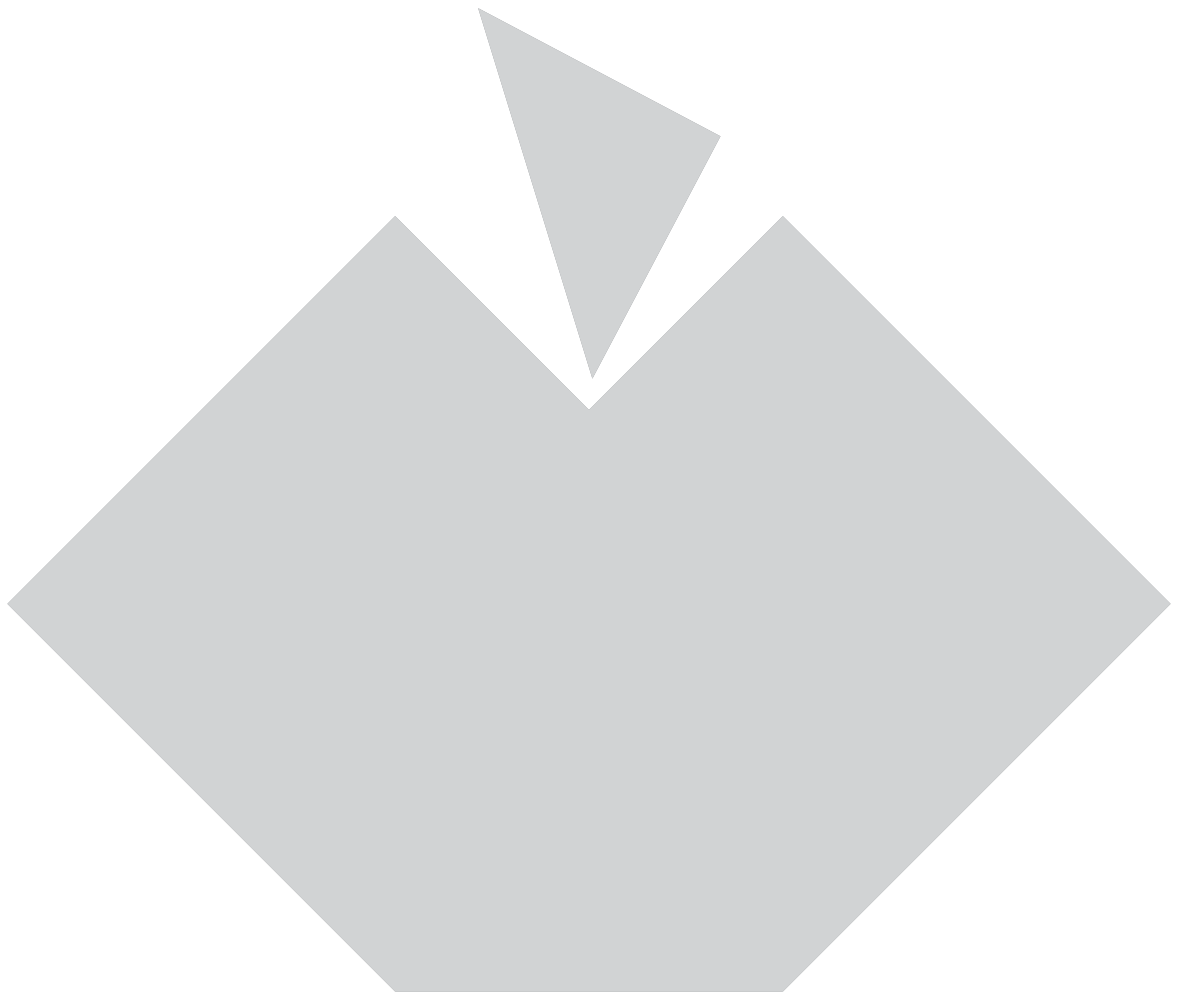


# Executive Tangrams

2. All men have an **Adams** apple.




3. **Jefferson** is on the five cent piece.



4. **Madison** was the name of a mermaid in the movie Splash.

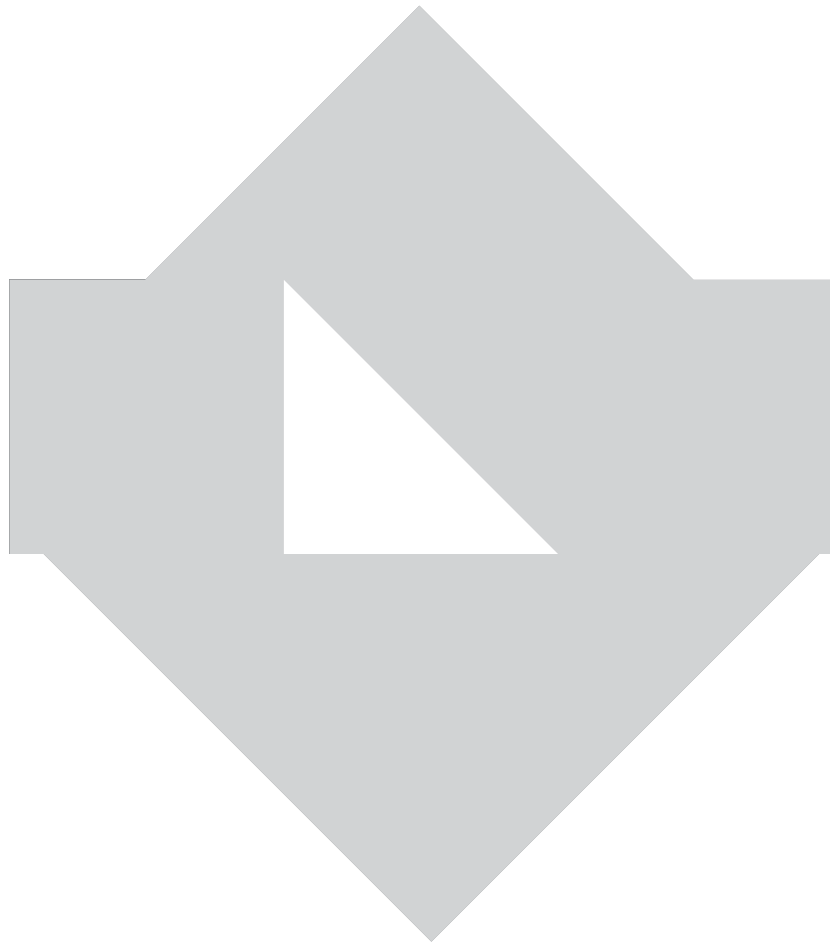


5. The **Monroe** Doctrine protected South America as well as the United States.

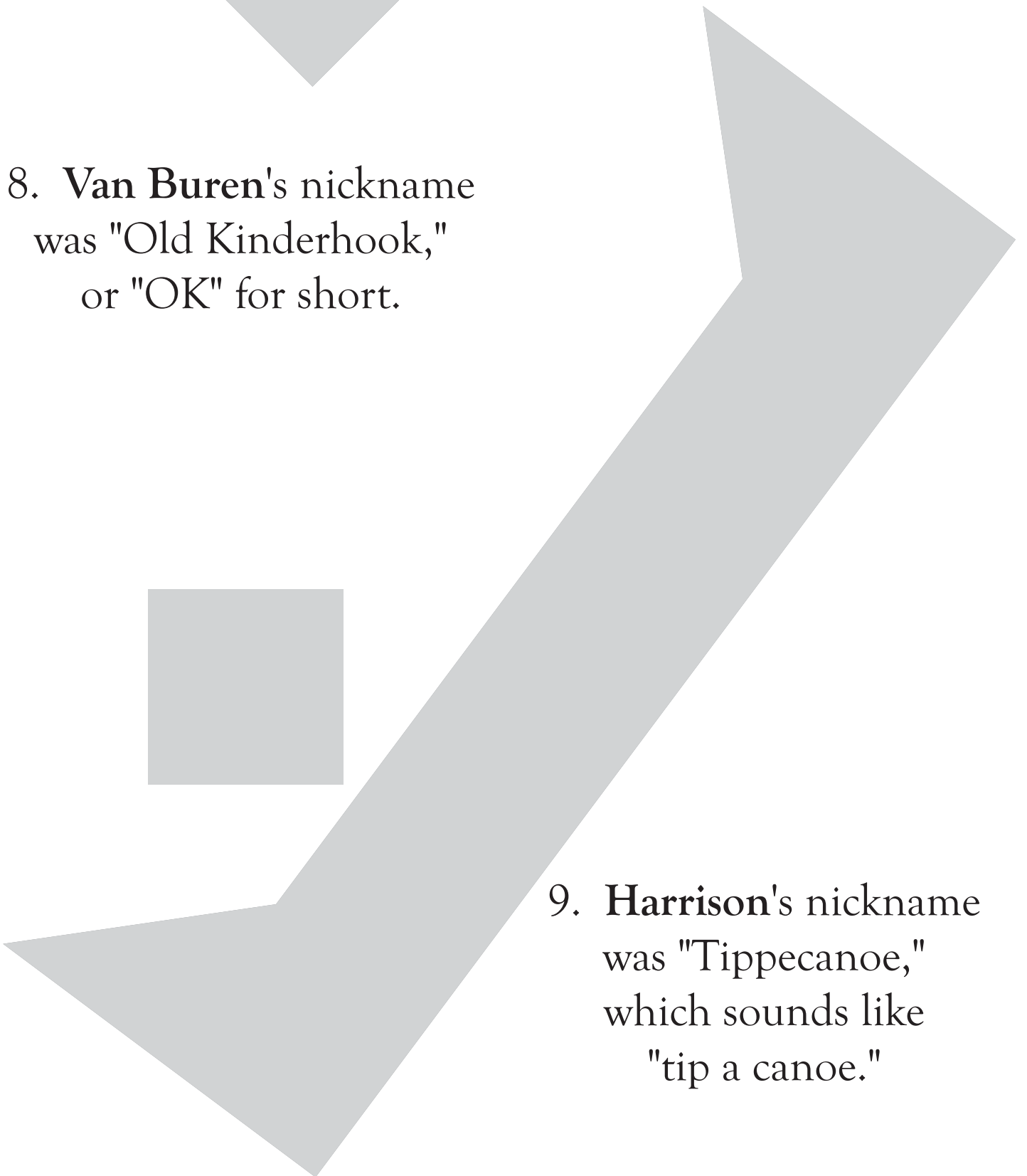
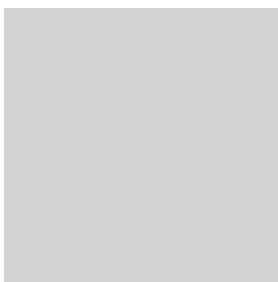

or "OK" for short.



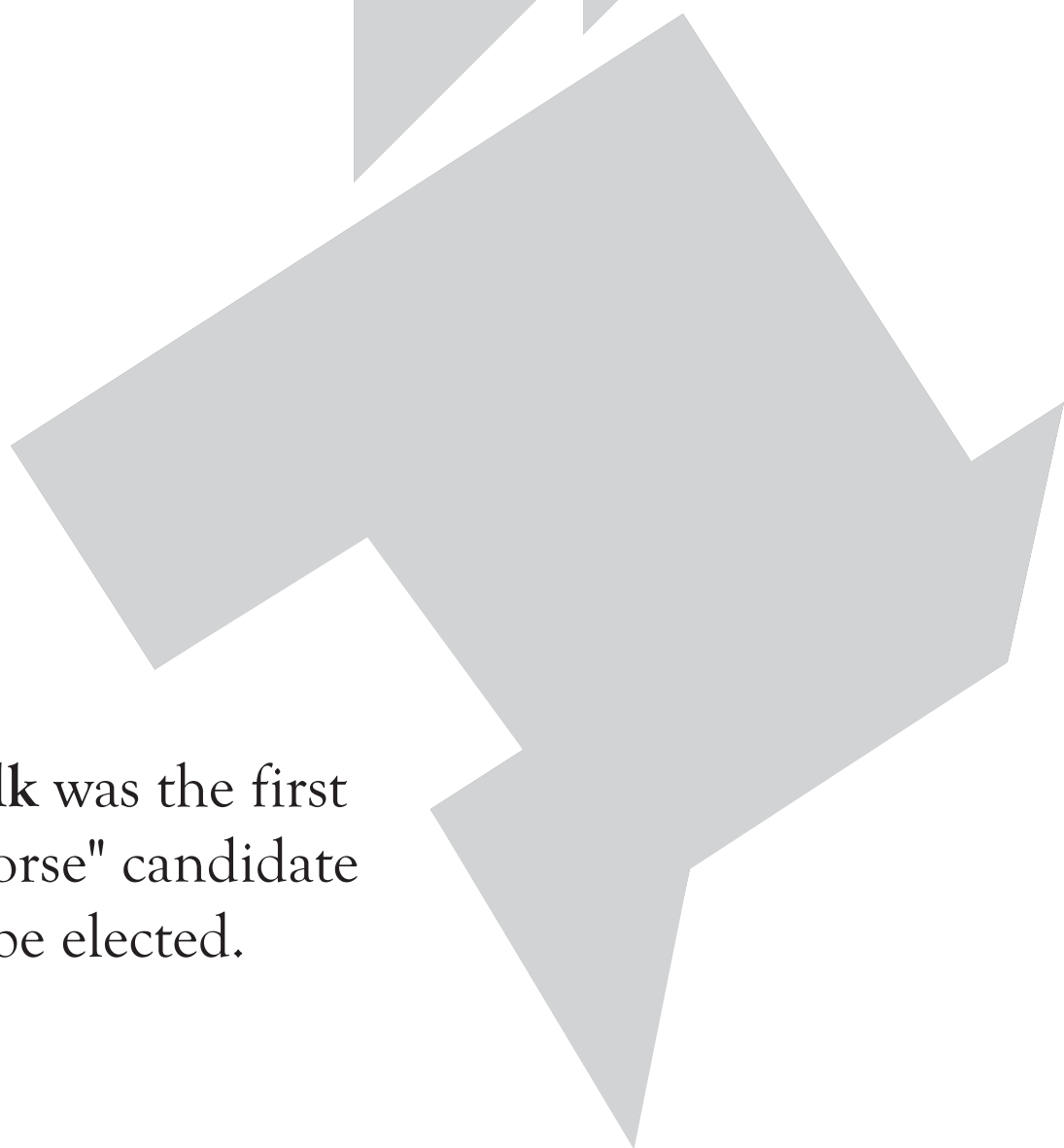
9. **Harrison's** nickname

to be elected.

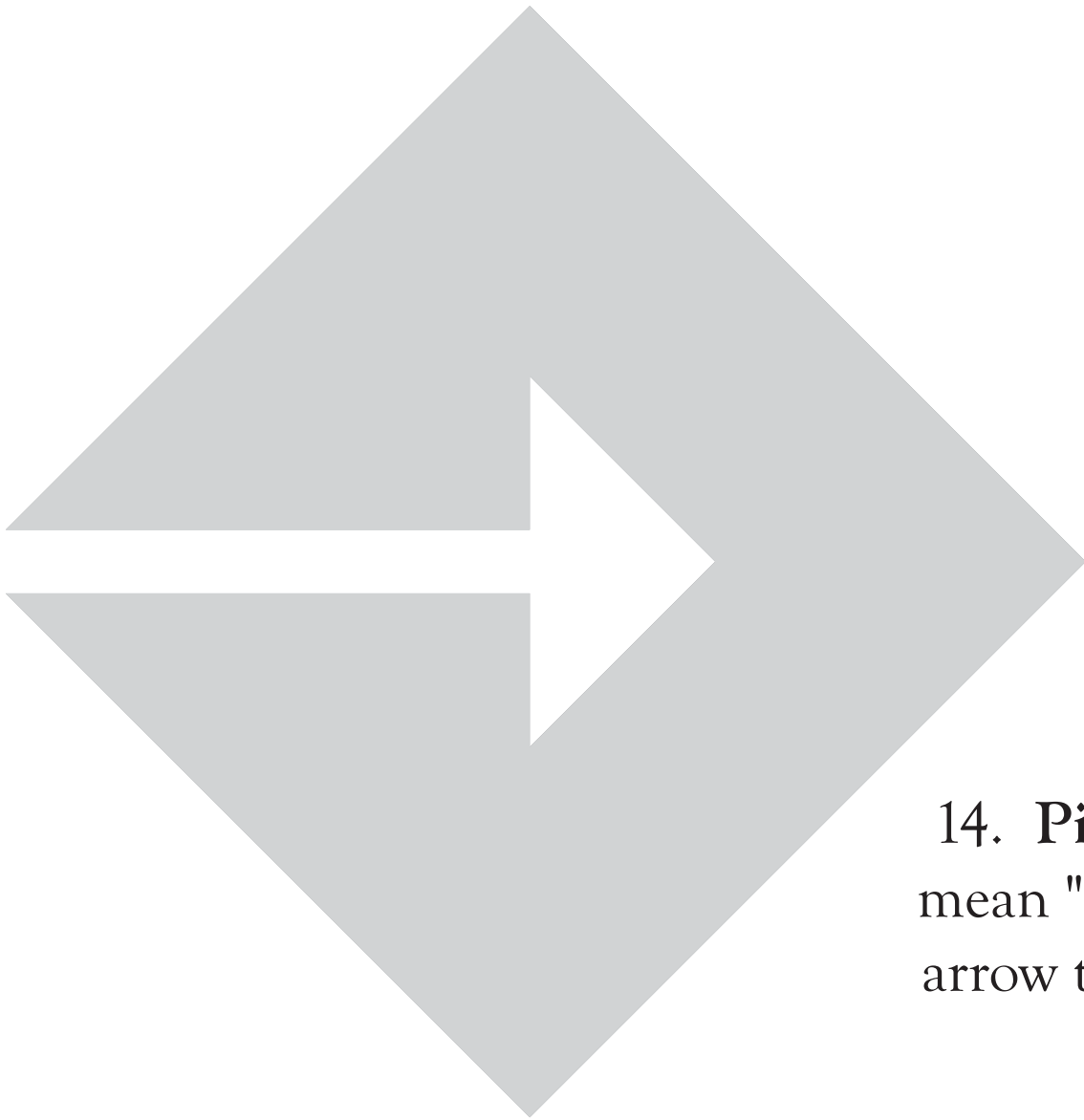


12. Zack **Taylor** was the

14. **Pierce** can mean "to put an arrow through."

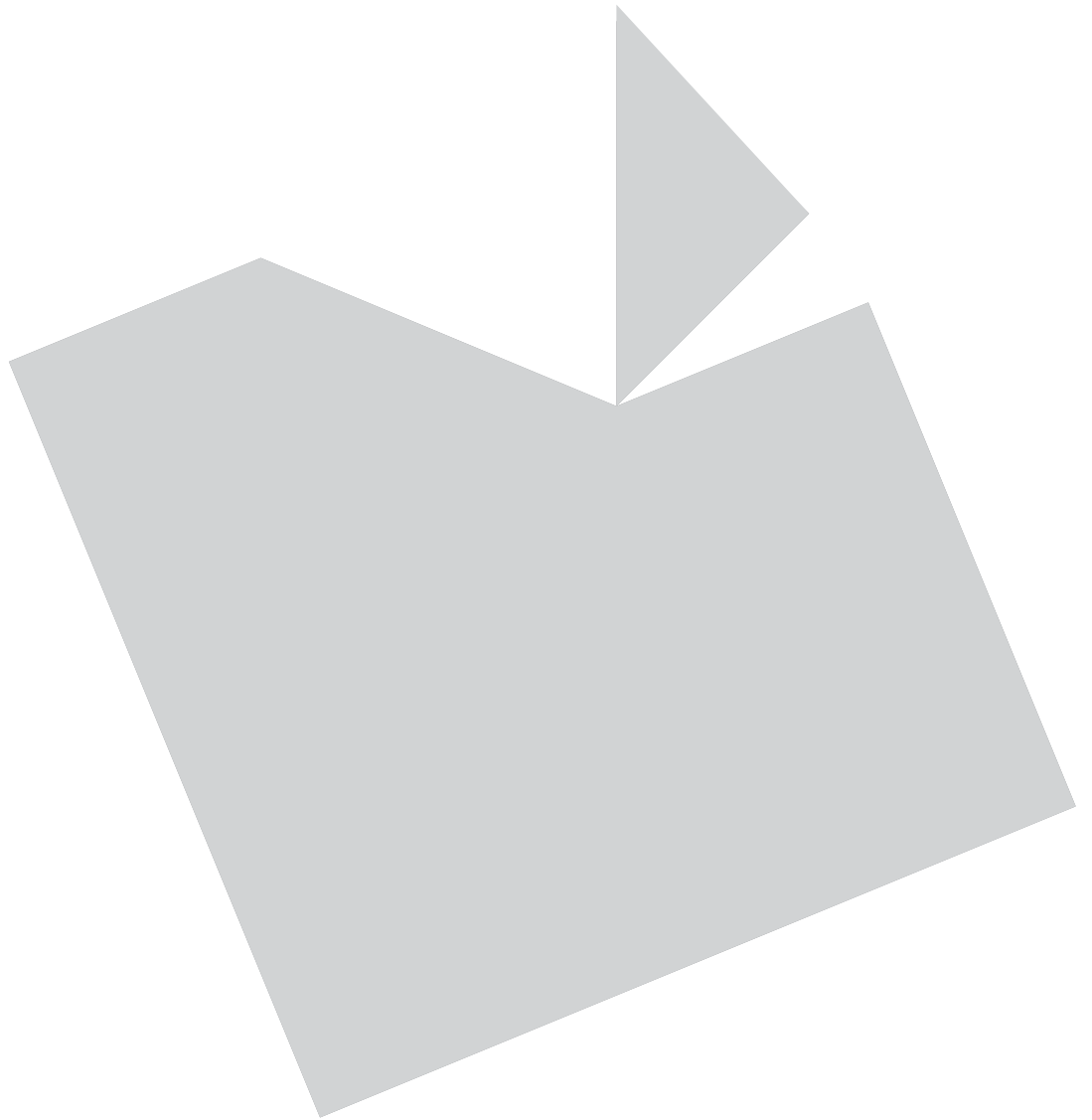


15. **Buchanan** is the only president who never married.
